Developing Supply Chain Leaders

What is the initiative?

Supply chain management requires dedicated and competent immunisation supply chain leaders with adequate numbers of skilled, competent, accountable, motivated, and empowered personnel at all levels of the health system to overcome existing and emerging immunisation supply chain challenges. The Supply Chain Leadership Initiative (SCLi) aims to support countries to establish and/or reinforce, the role of the Immunization Supply Chain Manager, to ensure dedicated supply chain leaders are in place at all levels of the health system with the right capabilities, authority and accountability.

Immunisation supply chain risk will increase due to higher volumes, doses and vaccine cost

Why is Supply Chain Leadership so critical?

Effectively responding to the evolving immunization supply chain requires not only a competent, recognized and supported supply chain workforce with significant technical and managerial capacity, but also high level champions, and an environment that enables and empowers the workforce. Effective leadership is essential for ensuring that the structures and systems are in place for skills and competencies to be successfully applied and for good supply chain management practices to be sustained.
