Reflection exercise (~30 mins)

Collective Impact in Country | Reflection Activity

Exercise goal: To reflect on which elements of collective impact you are already doing through your country in your immunization supply chain work today and what additional elements could be helpful for your work moving forward (you can note your thoughts on the reverse).

 Common Agenda <i>e.g., cMYP</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All participants share a vision for change that includes a common understanding of the problem and a joint approach to solving the problem through agreed-upon actions 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Today: Is there a common EPI/iSC Plan that guides the immunization work of multiple stakeholders (e.g., cMYP)? Tomorrow: Should more people be engaged in developing the plan to build buy-in (e.g., sub-national government)? Is this used to continually improve the work over time?
 Shared Measurement <i>e.g., EVM/iSC Indicators</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All participants agree on how to measure and report on progress, with a short list of common indicators/measures identified and used to drive learning and improvement 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Today: Are there common indicators to measure on progress/inform continuous improvement (e.g., EVM/iSC Indicators) across all stakeholders (i.e., Government, TA Providers, Donors, etc.)? Tomorrow: How can we use data more effectively at the sub-national and health facility level? Can we triangulate with usage data to get a fuller picture?
 Mutually Reinforcing Activities <i>E.g., Annual EPI Workshop</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A diverse set of stakeholders, typically across sectors, coordinate a set of differentiated activities through a mutually reinforcing plan of action 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Today: To what extent are the activities of various stakeholders align with the cMYP? Is there an Annual EPI work plan? How much do stakeholder's activities complement each other? Tomorrow: Who else is missing? What else needs to be done what is currently a gap?
 Continuous Communication <i>E.g., iSC Logistics Working Group</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All players engage in frequent and structured open communication to build trust, assure mutual objectives, and create common motivation through steering committees, working groups and other communication channels 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Today: Do you feel that the right stakeholders are regularly engaged and informed in the activities and progress of the EPI/iSC Plan (E.g., via national/sub-national logistics working groups)? Tomorrow: Who else is missing? Are sub-national working groups also needed to drive action across the county?
 Backbone Support <i>E.g., EPI/MoH Team?</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> An independent, dedicated, and funded staff guides the vision and strategy, supports aligned activities, establishes shared measurement practices, builds public will, advances policy, and mobilizes resources 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Today: Is there a clear, dedicated team that has the capacity to guide the EPI/iSC Plan development, collates data from multiple groups and supports the national/sub-national working groups (E.g., Expanded Program on Immunization (EPI) Team? Etc.)? Tomorrow: How might this role be strengthened / resourced?
