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# Background

- In the last couple of years, Nigeria has experiences challenges with its Polio eradication Program.
- The total number of WPV cases for Nigeria 2013 remains 53
- In 2013 there were reports of violence against vaccinators

# **Overall objective**

 To understand reasons for low vaccination coverage and to produce information that can be directly used to design education and communication campaigns to increase overall vaccination compliance.


# **Critical Polio Program Questions**

- Who is missed by the vaccination campaigns? Which parents refuse to vaccinate which children? Is refusal consistent or situational?
- To what extent is non vaccination the result of a lack of demand? Are children unvaccinated because of a lack of demand and parental refusal or evasion, or because of operational difficulties in the campaigns?
- What contributes to the lack of demand? What social and cultural meanings are attached to vaccination? What role does informal conversation and community gossip play in explaining parents' evasion or refusal of polio vaccination?
- What can we learn from successful vaccination teams about how to improve demand for polio vaccination?


# **Objective of the Training**


- The main objectives of the training will be to:
